### STRIKE!

Scholarship funds provided by the St. Andrew's Society helped support research associated with the forthcoming biography of Ellen Dawson, the young Scottish woman who was co-director of the infamous 1929 Loray Mill Strike in Gastonia.

Dawson was born into working-class poverty in an industrial village on the outskirts of Glasgow in 1900. She went to work in the local textile mills just as World War I began, witnessing the events of Red Clydeside, the most turbulent period in Scottish labor history.

After the war, Dawson came to America. During the late 1920s she rose to become a prominent labor activist.

*Strike! The Radical Insurrections of Ellen Dawson*, by David Lee McMullen, will be available in August from the University Press of Florida.

The book may also be ordered at a pre-release discount through Amazon.com.

McMullen was supported by the Society between 2002 and 2004, as he worked toward a doctorate in history at the University of Aberdeen.
